### Pajama Game - Audition Information

Auditions for the first production of SLOCs 83rd season, The Pajama Game, are set for Tuesday, June 16th and Thursday June 18th, 2009, at the Opera House, 826 State Street, with sign in beginning at 7:00 p.m. Auditions will begin promptly at 7:30. The Pajama Game is a romping musical set around a pajama factory in the 1950's. Conditions at the Sleep-Tite Pajama Factory are anything but peaceful as sparks fly between new superintendent Sid Sorokin and Babe Williams, leader of the union grievance committee. Their stormy relationship comes to a head when the workers strike for a 7 ½ cent pay increase, setting off not only a conflict between management and labor, but a battle of the sexes as well.

Director Jenny Depew is working closely with her Producers, Jodi Hebert and Regina Baker, Musical Director Malcolm Kogut and Choreographer, Donna Hatch, to staff the show. Anyone interested in working on the show is invited to contact the names above.



Each auditioner should prepare 16 bars of music that will showcase their vocal talent. A song from the show is preferable, but another similar tune will be acceptable. An accompanist will be provided. There will be a dance audition for everyone as well as set reading. Character descriptions are below. The production dates are October 16-18 and 22-25, 2009. Scripts or vocal scores are not available from the production team prior to auditions.

### **CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS**

**Sid Sorokan**: lost in life, Sid is finding a new job and new love at the Sleep-Tite Pajama Factory. He is the handsome Superintendent that falls for the head of the union's Grievance Committee. Sparks fly...literally! Songs: A New Town is a Blue Town, Hey There, Small Talk, There Once was a Man. Range: Bari-Tenor

Babe Williams: the head of the factory's grievance committee. Babe is strong willed and tough, but woman enough to see the new superintendent as a good catch. Will the need for a pay raise come between union and management in their relationship also? Songs: I'm Not at All in Love; Small Talk, There Once was a Man, Hey There. Range: Mezzo-Belt Hines: comedic time-study man, often drunk, always in a hurry. Songs: The Pajama Game, I'll Never Be Jealous Again, Think of the Time I Save. Range: Bari-tenor

Prez: Union President, a bit of a letch with the ladies. Songs: Her Is, 7 ½ cents. Range: Baritone

**Gladys:** PJ Factory worker that helps entertain the workers with Steam Heat at the union rally. Legit dancers needed. Songs: Her Is, Steam Heat. Range: Mezzo

**Mabel:** older secretary in the factory; a real spitfire. Song: I'll Never Be Jealous Again. Range: Soprano

**Hasler:** Factory President, tough on finance,;keep-your-dukes-up attitude. No song.

Mae: misguided worker. Song: Her Is. Range: Alto/Mezzo

Pop: Babe's agreeable father. No song.

There will be an additional 10-12 actors cast for other characters as well as the dancing and singing ensemble.

I first joined SLOC in 1988 as a member of the <u>Gondoliers</u> chorus. My next show for SLOC was in 1993 as Theodora Barracuda in <u>Tied to the Tracks: A Melodrama</u>. Because of family and work responsibilities this was followed by a long hiatus from theatrical performance during which my involvement with SLOC was as a frequent and appreciative audience member. In 2005 I was cast in <u>Sullivan and Gilbert</u> and most recently I was one of the four performers in the 2009 production of <u>Jacques Brel Is Alive and Well and Living in Paris.</u>

As well as SLOC I have performed with Opera Excelsior, Temple Thespians and Glimmerglass Opera; in cabaret performances with Holy Smoke Producktions; and as an oratorio soloist with Octavo Singers and Voices of Cooperstown. I have been a cantorial soloist at Congregation Gates of Heaven in Schenectady for 24 year and recruit and hire the professional quartet for the High Holiday and special services.

For 25 years I worked for NYS state as an analyst within the field of Human Resources, retiring as a manager of a small group of analysts. My work required highly developed analytical and problem solving skills as well very strong communication and interpersonal skills. It also required the ability to balance multiple competing priorities and to constantly deal with a variety of people all seeking to achieve their own goals as soon as possible often while providing as little cooperation as possible.
